In accordance with the provisions of section 28 of Act VII of 1878 (Indian Forest Act), the Hon'able the Lieutenant – Governor of the Punjab is pleased to declare the provisions of Chapter – IV of that Act applicable to all forest and Waste lands in the Kangra, Palampur, Dehra , Nurpur and Hamirpur Tehsils of the Kangra district, upon which the trees have been declared in the Revenue Settlement Records to belong to the Government except the forest and waste lands included in the schedule annexed to this notification.

IV) Notification No. 2839- A, dated the 31st August, 1915

The following rules apply to the areas declared protected Forests by Notification No. 2839 – A, dated 31st August, 1915 (Demarcated Protected Forests):-

- 1) Except where the country is stated, these rules apply to the Protected Forests of both classes.
- 2) In these rules, unless there is something repugnant in the subject or context: - “Record – of – Rights” means the record prepared in accordance with Section 28 of the Indian Forest Act.
“Bartandar” means a person entitiled, by virtue of being the owner of cultivated land or of being the agricultural tenant of such an owner or of being possessed of special right over land of forest produce which is the property of another.

“Right holder” includes every person entitled to a right over waste of forest land or forest produce in whatever capacity and for whatever reasons he exercises that right. “Trees”, “Timber”, “Cattle”, Forest Officer and “Forest produce” have the same meaning as in the Indian Forest Ac, 1878.

“Land assessed to revenue”, includes land which though liable to assessment, was not charged with revenue at the internal distribution of the of the last assessment beenbrought under cultivation or enclosed with the permission of competent authority, wherever such permission was necessary.

- 3) The grazing the cattle in demarcated protected forests is prohibited, except by right holders in the exercise of right admitted in the detailed Forest record – of – right. Only such cattle may be grazed as are kept by right holders for the bonafide agricultural and domestic perposes. The right does not extend to cattle kept for trade or pastoral purposes.

- 4) (1) Except as provided in Rule 25 or in the detailed revenue record for each village, no person other than the proprietors of the soil of an Undemarcated Protected Forest and the proprietors and agricultural tenants of cultivated land assessed to revenue in the village in which such forest is situated, may graze cattle in such forest.

(2) No such proprietors or tenats shall graze in any cattle except those kept by them for their own agricultural and domestic (not including) purposes.

5) (1) Nothing in the last to proceeding rules shall prevent Gaddi shepherds from grazing sheep and goats in the runs recorded in their names in the record – of – rights on payment of the dues fixed from time to time.

(2) Except under the orders of Raja in writing, Gaddi Shephards in going to and from their runs shall not halt their blocks for longer than one night at any single halting place in any forest in which they have not a right of grazing, and halting place shall be done place shall be 5 miles apart, provided that such shepherds, may halt two nights at one place if there has been heavy rain or if they have given salt to their flocks.

6) Nothing in Rules 3 and 4 shall prevent Gujjars from grazing in the Sowanas in which under the record – of – rights they have a right of grazing.

7) Khewatdars and Bartandars shall not sell or lease their right of grazing in the Protected Forests nor give permission to others to graze.

8) Except as provided in Rules 21, 22 and 23 the lopping, barking, cutting and removal of timber and trees in demarcated Protected Forests is prohibited, except by persons entered in the detailed forest record – of – rights, as having this right and subject to the provisions of these rules.

9) (1) Except as provided in Rules 21, 22, 23 and 24, no person other than the proprietors and agricultural tenants of cultivated land assessed to revenue in the village in which an Undemarcated Protected Forest is situatd shall lop, bark, cut or remove trees and timber in such forest.

(2) No such proprietors or tenant shall lop bark, cut or remove timber and trees in an undemarcated forest, except for his cown domestic and agricultural (not including pastoral) purposes, nor shall he do so for any such purpose unless it falls under one of the heading in paragraph 7 of the record – of – rights of the Protected Forests of Nadaun, Goler, Dada – Siba and Kutlehar.

10) Except as provided in Rule 20, no timber or trees shall be lopped, barked, cut or removed without a permit garnted in accordance with these rules.

11) Green brushwood may be cut by bartandars for the purposes mentioned in the next following rule under a permit granted by the lambardars of the village, or other person specially authorized in this behalf.

12) (1) The Raja may give permits to bartandars to cut and lop trees requird by them for the following purposes to the extent of their actual requirements:-

(a) For making fences.

(b) For fuel for marriage feasts.

- © For fuel for funeral ceremonies, such as, Mukan, Suhog and Chaubarak.
- (d) For making agricultural and domestic implements.
- (e) For making Charcoal for manufacture and repair of agricultural implements.
- (f) For the supply of fuel and encamping – grounds but not otherwise for sale or barter.
- (g) For making machans.

(2) Such trees may only be taken after being marked by a Forest Officer, who will cause trees that may be cut and lopped under this rule to be marked in suitable numbers and in reasonably convenient localities, but in all cases crooked, malformed and dry trees and such trees as can be removed in thinning must be marked first. When such trees are not suitable or available, other trees may be marked, but in every case strict regard must be paid to the interests of forest growth and regeneration.

(3) Chil and bamboo may only be marked and cut or lopped when no other suitable tree is available, and the Raja shall report to the Deputy Commissioner the grant of all permits to cut or lop these trees.

13) If the lambardar is unfit to be entrusted with the powers described in rule 11 and 25 or if has abused his powers, the Raja may appoint any other person whom he may consider qualified, and such other person shall then exercise the authority conferred by these rules on lambardar.

14) Trees required for building purposes may not be cut except under the permit of the Raja.

15) (1) Trees for building purposes will not ordinarily be granted oftener than once in five years to any bartandar, but on special application to the Raja, and for special cause shown (e.g. the burning of the applicant's house), the Raja may grant trees at a shorter interval than five years to meet the actual requirements of a bartandar. The Raja shall report all such grants to the Deputy Commissioner.

(2) Bartandars shall not be refused trees required for the repair of one building merely because they have received trees within five years for the construction or repair of another building.

16) Trees given for building purposes must be utilized for the construction or repair of buildings within the limits of the village where the cultivated land is situated on account of which the trees are given, unless the contrary has been specially allowed.

17) No trees standing within 10 years of any public road shall be cut without the permission of the Deputy Commissioner.

18) In case where land revenue has been assessed on the right to timber, no permit shall be granted until such revenue has been paid.

19) All permits to bartandars to cut and remove trees (including brushwood) shall remain in force only for three months from the date of the permit or of the trees being marked under rule 12, whichever is later.

If trees are not removed from the forest within that period the permit shall lapse, and thereafter the trees shall not be cut or removed unless the permit is renewed by authority that first granted it.

20) No permit is necessary for doing any of the acts next here in after mentioned but nothing in this rule shall confer upon any person any right not recorded in the record – of – rights as enjoyed by him.

The acts reffered to are as follows:-

(1) The cutting and removal of:-

(a) all fallen timber;

(b) stumps, provided that the mark made the forest Official is left intact;

© dry standing trees of less than a hat h in girth at breast height;

(d) branches of dry standing trees of a hath or more in girth at breast height, provided that the trees themselves are not cut.

Nothing in this clause shall be deemed to allow the cutting and removal without permit of any timber or dry standing trees from any forest that has been burnt.

(2) The removal by hand of twings of trees other than chil or bamboo for bedding or fodder or manure, provided that the trees are not less that a hath in girth at breast height, that the branches taken do not exceed a finger in thickness and are only taken from the lower half of the tree.

(3) The removal of the leaves:-

(a) of the amil and dhao (Chal) for tanning purposes;

(b) of the taur and other creepers for domestic purposes;

(4) The cutting and removal for burning the dead to an amount sufficient for that purpose of any trees except chil and bamboo; provided that where other trees are not available chil may be cut for this purpose.

Notices of all such cutting shall be given to the rakha or other Forest Official within 10 days.

(5) Chil may only be lopped with the Raja's permit given under rule 12.

21) The proprietors of the soil of the Protected Forests may remove from the areas of which they are proprietors, dry fallen wood fit only for fuel.

22) Gujars entitled to graze their cattle under Rule 7 mey, within the area in which they have a right of grazing, take dry fallen wood fit only for fuel.

23) Gaddi shepherds who are entitled to graze under Rule 6 may, within the areas over which they have right of grazing, take dry fallen wood fit for fuel and may take by hand twigs for fodder, subject to the restriction imposed by Rule 20 (2).

24) Non – agricultural residents and traders and travelers through Nadaun, Goler, Dada Siba and Kutlehar may, if the right holders do not object, graze their own cattle, collect dry fallen wood fit only for fuel, and cut grass in the undemarcated forest of the village in which they reside or through which they are passing but these privileges may only be exercised in the case of non – agricultural residents, for their own domestic requirements, and in the case of travellers and traders, while bonafide traveling in Nadaun, Goler, Dada Siba and Kutlehar, and for their requirements as travelers, and in case of abuse may be withdrawn by Government.

25) The removal of bark from green trees is prohibited, but the bark of the taur and of other creepers may be removed by bartandars under the permit of the lamberdar.

26) The gridling and trapping of trees and removal of wood for torches from standing chil trees are forbidden.

27) (1) No land in the demarcated forests may be appropriated, broken up or cleared for cultivation on for any other purpose.

(2) No land in the undemarcated forest may be appropriated, broken up or cleared for cultivation or for any other purpose, without the permit of the Raja, which sanction may only be granted under the following conditions:-

(a) That there are no trees standing on the land.

(b) That the land adjoins an existing main block of cultivation.

© That other Khewatdars and bartandars do not object.

(d) That the land has been inspected by a Forest Officer, who has satisfied himself that the above conditions have been observed.

(3) No land in the protected forest may be appropriated by Raja for the purpose of a godam without the permission of the dupty commissioner.

28) No timber or trees acquire under these rule or by the bartandars in the exercise of their rights may be sold, bartered or in any way alienated, nor may such timber or trees be applied to any but the purpose for which it or they were acquired; provided that nothing in this rule shall prevent the sale of fruit, flowers, medicinal and edible roots and leaves, and the leaves of creepers, nor the sale of wood for fuel at encamping grounds nor the sale or other alienation of timber and trees acquired under rule

29) The felling and removal of trees belonging to Government for purposes of trade (including the supply of the tea industry), and the granting of licences to fell and remove such trees and timber for these purpose, shall be in the hands of the Raja subject to the conditions laid down between him and the Govt. for the management of the forests.

Such trees or timber shall not be cut or removed, nor shall licenses for their removal be granted to an extent that will interfere with the due supply of the requirement of the bartandars.

30) If the exercise of the rights as admitted in any forests would endanger the existence of the forest, the Forest Officer, with the sanction of the Deputy Commissioner may define by numbers or otherwise the aggregated extent to which the rights can safely be exercised over the forest and the extent to which each right holder is, in accordance with paragraph 18 of the record – of – rights, entitled to exercise his rights.

31) Nets, ropes and snares may not be set in Waziri Rupī without the permission of the Raja of Rupī and in the rest of the Kullu Sub – Division without a permit from the Assistant commissioner.

32) If the exercise of the rights as admitted in any forest would endanger the existence of the forest and the Forest Officer, with the sanction of the Deputy Commissioner, may define by number or otherwise the aggregate extent to which the rights can safely be exercised over the forest, and the extent to which each right – holder is in accordance with paragraph 10 of the record – of – rights entitled to exercise his rights.

V) Notification no. 61 dated the 26 January, 1897 Amended by No. 994.

Dated 11th January, 1919

The following rules are prescribed for the preservation, reproduction and disposal of the trees standing on the lands shown in the schedule annexed to these rules which, though grown on private lands belonging to persons, are declared in the Land Revenue Records of the Kangra District to belong to the Government, subject to the rights of agriculturists as recorded in these records:-

1. In these rules unless there is something repugnant in the subject or context “tree”, “timber”, have the same meaning as in the Indian Forest Act.
2. The rules apply only to the trees and to the timber of the trees that have grown spontaneously or have been planted by the Government on the lands shown in the schedule annexed to the rules, and which have been declared in the Land Revenue Records to be the property of the Government.
3. The lopping, barking, cutting and removal of timber and trees are prohibited except in accordance with the provisions of these rules.
4. Except as provided in Rules 21, 22, 23, 24, no person other than the proprietors of cultivated land in the five tehsils of Kangra assessed to revenue and their agricultural tenants shall, lop, bark, cut or remove timber and trees.
5. No such proprietors or tenants shall lop, bark, cut or remove timber and trees except for their own domestic and agricultural (not including pastoral) purposes.
6. Except as provided in Rule 19, no timber or trees may be lopped, barked, cut or removed without a permit granted in accordance with these rules.
- 7) For the purposes of these rules, trees are divided into two classes:-

8. Trees of 2nd class may be cut for the purposes mentioned in the next following rule under written permit given by the lambardar of the village or other person specially authorized in this behalf.

9. (1) The lambardar of a village, or where there are several lambardars, then the lambardars specially authorized in this behalf may give permits to cut trees of the 2nd class required for the following purposes to the extent of the actual requirements of the applicants:-

- (a) For making fences;
- (b) For fuel for marriage feasts;
- ©For fuel for funeral ceremonies, such as mukan, Suhog, Chaubarak;
- (d) For making agricultural and domestic emplement;
- (e) For making charcoal for the manufacture and repair of agricultural implements;
- (f) For the supply of fuel at encamping – grounds, but not otherwise for sale or barter;
- (g) For making machans (mana, than) for watching crops.

(2) Lambardars authorized to give permits under this rule may not give permits for trees even of the 2nd class, if the trees are required for the construction or repair of dwelling houses, cattle sheds or of any other building what so ever.

10. (1) If trees of the 2nd class are not available in any village, the lambardar may, with the special permission of the Deputy Commissioner, give permits for cutting crooked and unsound trees of the 1st class except:-

And also for looping oak and chil trees to one – half of their height, for the puposes detailed in the last preceding rule.

(2) The officer will cause trees that may be cut and lopped under this rule to be marked in suitable numbers and in reasonably convenient localities, and when there are trees so marked, the permits shall apply only to such trees.

11. If the lambardar is unfit to be entrusted with the authority described in Rules 8, 9 and 25, or if he has abused the authority conferred on him, the Deputy Commissioner may appoint any other person whom he may consider qualified, and such person shall then exercise the authority conferred by these rules on lambardars.

12. Trees of whatever class required for building purposes may not be cut except under the permit of the Forest Officer.

13. (1) Trees for building purposes will ordinarily not be granted than once in five years, but on special application to the Deputy Commissioner and for special causes shown (e.g. burning of the applicant's house or other misfortune) the Deputy Commissioner may grant trees at a shorter interval than five years to meet the actual requirements of the applicants.

(2) Trees required for the repairs of one building shall not be refused merely because trees have been given within five years to the same applicant for the construction or repair of another building.

14. When trees have been given for building purposes, the building shall be constructed within the limits of the village where the cultivated land on account of which the trees are given is situated, unless the contrary has been specially allowed.

15. No tree standing within 10 yards of any public road may be cut except with the permission of the Deputy Commissioner.

16. In cases where revenue has been assessed on the right to timber under the land revenue assessment, no permit shall be granted until such revenue has been paid.

17. Trees granted under permits may not be cut or removed until marked by a Forest Official duly authorized in this behalf.

18. All permits granted for cutting trees (including brushwood) shall remain in force only for three months from the date of the permits. If the trees are not removed within that period, the permit shall lapse, and the trees may not be cut or removed unless the permit is renewed by the authority that first granted it.

19. No permit is necessary for doing any of the acts next hereinafter mentioned, but nothing in this rule shall confer upon any person any right to which he is not otherwise entitled.

The acts referred to are as follows:-

(1) The cutting and removal of:-

(a) all fallen timber;

(b) stumps;

© dry standing trees for less than a hath in girth at the ground or more, provided that the trees themselves are not cut.

(2) The lopping for fodder or for bedding and manure of all trees not mentioned in Rule 20, provided that the trees are not less than a hath in girth at the ground and that the branches cut do not exceed a finger in thickness and that the trees are not lopped to more than one – half of their height.

(3) The removal of the leaves:-

(a) of the amil and the dhau (or Chal) for tanning purposes, and

(b) of the taur and other creepers for domestic purposes.

(4) The cutting and removal for burning the dead to an amount sufficient for that purpose:-

(a) of any trees of the 2nd class, and

(b) where trees of the 2nd class, are not easily procurable, then any trees of the 1st class, except:

Deodar, Elm, Kikar, Kakaran, Rai, Tun, Khark, Harar, Tos, Duri, Gun (Khanor), Mahwa, Walnut, Tali, Mandar, Bahera, Box, Sal, Olive. Notice all of such cutting shall be given to the rakha or other Forest Official within ten days.

i) (1) The following trees may not be lopped, for any purpose what so ever:-

Deodar, Tun, Olive, Rai, Duri, Rhododendron, Tos, Talli, kakaran, Walnut, Kikar, Box, Sal.

(2) Chil may be lopped only with the lambardars permit given under Rule 10(1).

21. The proprietors of the soil of the land detailed in the Schedule annexed to these rules may, as such remove from the areas of which they are proprietors dry fallen wood fit only for fuel.

22. Ban Gujars, SawandarGujars and other persons entitled under the Land Revenue Record to graze their cattle in the lands detailed in the said schedule may, within the areas over which they have a right of grazing, take dry fallen wood fit only for fuel, and may lop trees for fodder, subject to the restrictions imposed in Rule 19(2).

23. Gaddi shepherds, who are entitled under the land Revenue Records to graze their flocks in the lands detailed in the said schedule, may within the areas over which they have a right of grazing, take dry fallen wood fit only for fuel and may lop trees for fodder, but only for kids and subject to the restrictions imposed in Rule 19(2).

24. Non – agricultural residents of the of the villages mentioned in the schedule of these rules and travelers and traders passing through them may collect dry fallen wood fit only for fuel from the land

described in the said schedule. But this licence may be exercised only for their own domestic requirements and in the case of travelers and traders while bonafide travelling through these villages and in case of abuse may be withdrawn by Government.

25. The removal of bark from green trees is prohibited, but the bark of the taru and of other creepers may be removed under the permit of the lambardar.

26. The gridling and the tapping of trees and the removal of wood for torches from standing chail trees are prohibited.

27. No timber or trees acquired under these rules may be sold, bartered, or in any way, alienated, nor may such timber or trees be applied to any but the purpose for which they were acquired provided that nothing in this rule shall prevent the sale of fruits, flowers medicinal and edible roots and the leaves of creepers, nor the sale of wood for fuel at encamping – grounds, nor the sale or other alienation of timber and trees acquired under Rule 29.

28. It is prohibited to kindle a fire without taking all reasonable precautions to prevent its spreading to any of the 1st class trees, and also to leave burning any fire in the vicinity of any such trees.

29. The felling and removal of timber and trees belonging to Government for the purposes of trade, including the supply of the tea industry, and the trees for these purposes and the payments to be made in respect thereof, shall be at the discretion of the Forest Officer acting under the control of the Deputy Commissioner.

The Forest Officer shall not fell or remove such trees or timber, nor grant licences for their removal to an extent that will interfere with the due supply of the requirements of persons entitled to any right over the trees and timber.

No. FFE-B-A(3)4/99 Dated Shimla – 2, the 10th September, 2002

ORDER

(1) Whereas, the State Government is satisfied, after due enquiry, Under Section 7 of the Himachal Pradesh Land Preservation Act, 1978 that regulations, restrictions, prohibitions of directions contained in this order are necessary for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Act.

(2) Now, therefore, the Governor, Himachal Pradesh in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Himachal Pradesh Land Preservation Act 1978 (Act. No. 28 of 1978) is pleased to temporarily regulate, restrict and prohibit throughout the areas (except in Municipal Corporation/ Municipal Committees, area of other local bodies) specified in the schedule annexed to Himachal Pradesh Notification of even No dated 30.5.1979 in Hamirpur District the following acts for a period of 30 years with effect from the date of publication of this order in the Rajpatra Himachal Pradesh in the manner indicated below:-

1) The cutting of trees or timber and removal there of in such areas shall be prohibited provided that there will be no restriction on the use of forest produce for bonafide domestic purposes of fuel and fodder;

Provided further that the owner may for their bonafide domestic and agricultural use fell up to five trees each year without permission, up to 10 trees with written permission of the concerned Range Officer and more than 10 trees with written permission of the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

Provided further that the trees for sale shall be felled in accordance with the 10 years felling programme, which will be framed by the officers of the Forest department and approved by the State

Government subject to the condition that trees used for timber and other purposes will be felled after obtaining permission of the Divisional Forest Officer concerned up to 50 trees in a year, of the Conservator of Forests up to 100 trees in year, of the Chief Conservator of Forests up to 200 trees in year and the State Government for more than 200 trees and that for other trees the permission will be accorded by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned in accordance with the 10 years felling programme.

Provided further that any person felling the trees either for domestic and agricultural use or for sale shall be required to plant at least 3 trees for one tree felled. In case, however, a fruit orchard is planted in such area, it shall be planted according to the norms laid down by the State Horticulture Department for complete stocking of the area.

2) Subject to the provisions of para 1 the extraction, collection or removal or subjection to any manufacturing process of any forest produce any such area shall be prohibited.

Provided further that extraction of resin will be undertaken with the written permission of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer in accordance with the instruction issued by the Chief Conservator of Forests from time to time laying down the period of extraction, number of blazes, length, width and depth of blazes and other related matter;

Provided further that the felling of bamboos will be regulated, according to 3 years felling programme. Which will be framed by the officers of the Forest Department and approved by the State Government and that the permission for felling of bamboos for sale will be granted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned in accordance with the 3 years felling programme.

3) The forest produce passing out of such areas shall be subject to examination by a forest officer and no forest produce will be removed by any person, even if it may have been extracted after obtaining permission aforesaid without obtaining an export permit for the same;

4) The authority empowered to grant permission for extraction of forest produce may while granting permission impose such conditions as may be necessary in the interest of forest conservancy and to avoid misuse of the forest produce so extracted;

5) Not with standing anything to he contrary contained in the foregoing paragraphs, the state Government may by general or special order allow the cutting or removal of any tree or class of trees subject to such condition as it may deem fit to impose where ever it is expedient to do so in the public interest such as grant of Nautor Land, Consolidation of holdings of dry trees/ fallen trees or in cases pending before 31.3.1979.

(3) This superseds this Department Notification of even No. dated 21.3.1980.

VIII) Notification No. 992 dated the 11.01.1919

In accordance with the provision of section 28 of Act VII of 1878 the Indian Forest Act, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Punjab is pleased in cancellation of Punjab Government Notification No. 58 dated the 26th January, 1897 to declare the provision of chapter IV of that act applicable to all areas in the Kangra, Palampur, Dehra, Nurpur and Hamirpur Tehsils of the Kangra District respect of which it is declared in the standing the Land Revenue Settlement of 1910 – 19 that the trees of spontaneous growth record standing on them belong to Govt. except the area included in the schedule annexed to this notification.

Schedule

- 1) Areas which have been declared Protected Forest by notification No. 57 dated the 26.01.1897 as amended by notification No. 91 dated 11.01.1919.
- 2) Areas which have been described as reserved or unclassed forests in the standing record on the Land Revenue Settlement of 1910 – 19.
- 3) Areas in Taluqua Nadaun and Kutlehar (Tehsil Hamirpur) and Mauzas Kothi Khor and Kothi Swar (Tehsil Palampur).
- 4) Those areas in which the Deputy Commissioner may from time to time sanction appropriation for cultivation or for any other purpose after payment to Government of the value of the trees standing thereon.

IX) Notification No. Fts. © 3- 4/80- dated the 12- 5- 1993

- 1) Whereas certain areas in the Protected Forests as also areas vested in the Government under the H.P. Ceiling on Land Holding Act, 1972 and village Common Lands (Vesting and Utilisation Act), 1974 and transferred or to be transferred to the Forest Department are barren or have degraded in the past due to heavy biotic pressure close to village and whereas these areas need immediate treatment through protection, afforestation, pasture development, soil conservation etc. so as to arrest their further environmental degradation and to augment fuel wood, fodder and small timber production for use by local people and whereas active participation of the local people is vital for planning, protection afforestation and judicious use for ecodevelopment of aforesaid areas.
- 2) Now, therefore, in pursuance of Government of India's letter (No. 6-21/89-FP) dated June, 1st 1990 from the then Secretary (Environment and Forests) to Forest Secretary of all states, it has been decided by the Government to constitute Village Forest Development Committees for Joint Forest Management in the villages of Himachal Pradesh for planning, protection, afforestation, judicious use of ecodevelopment of aforesaid areas thereby bringing 50% of the feasible area under forest cover by 2010 A.D. In accordance with the policy of JFPM detailed rules/ guidelines will be notified.
- 3) Produce for constitution of Forest Development Committee.
 - I) **Name of Committee:-** Village Forest Development Committee (V.F.D.C.)
 - II) **Definition:-** A Village Forest Development Committee is registered no political body representing all families of a Tikka/ Village.
 - III) **Area Selection:-** There shall be only one Village Forest Development Committee (VFDC) in each Tikka/ Village.

IV) **Constitution:-** One adult male and female member of each family will be enrolled as a member of the General House of VFDC of the village. President, Mahila Mandal, President, Yuval Mandal, Members of Panchayat representing Tika/ Village will be nominated as members of the General House of the VFDC by DFO concerned.

V) **Executive Body:-** The Executive Body will have 9 to 12 members including nominated ones. It will have President, Vice President, and Treasurer etc. who will be elected by the Executive Body itself. Two auditors will be elected in the General House.

A uniform representation shall be given to each group of 10 – 20 families and the executive body will have minimum 5 members from the Tikka/ Village out of which 50% will be women.

Forest Guard will be ex – official Members Secretary of the Executive Body.

One member of Gram Panchayat, one member from Antyodaya family, one woman either from Mahila Mandal or otherwise will also be nominated members of the Body.

VI) **Meetings:-** There will be two meetings of the General House and four of the Executive Body in a year. DFO will convene the meeting with the President of the Executive Body of VFDC and the Range Officer concerned twice in years to review the progress of the work. Quorum will be 50% for these meetings.

VII) **Registration of the Committee:-** VFDC will formally be registered by the territorial Divisional Forest Officer.

VIII) **Management Plan:-** The Range Officer concerned will prepare Integrated Resource Management Plan with the help of Executive Body which will be discussed with General House of VFDC and finally approved by the D.F.O.

IX) **Duties of VFDC:-**

1. To persuade the villages to give the available areas for plantation.
2. To assist the Forest Department in planning, protection, afforestation, judicious use of all existing rights and equitable sharing of usufructs and ecodevelopment of the area as per approved management plan.

X) **Responsibilities:-** It will be the responsibility of the committee to ensure the

- i) Just and fair distribution of the usufructs derived and
 - ii) To ensure its management as per prescribed norms:
3. Settlement of disputes between villagers;

4. Honour all the commitments.
- XI) **Power of the Committee:-** Committee will make its own bye – laws with the concurrence of concerned DFO. The committee can recommend punishment to the offenders, including cancellation of membership for forfeiture of their share in usufructs of the DFO concerned.
- XII) **Duties and Responsibilities of the Forest Department:-**
- iv) To explain Joint Management Plan to the villagers.
 - v) To recognize the VFDC in letter and spirit and give weightage to its recommendations.
 - d. To provide technical know – how; administrative and managerial skills; in order of assist the Executive Body to carry out the responsibilities.
- XIII) **Power of the Forest Department:-** Membership of any individual from the General House can be cancelled in consultation with the Executive Body. D.F.O. can dissolve the Executive Body in case it fails to fulfil its duties and responsibilities.
- XIV) **Dispute Arbitration Termination of Agreement:-** The entire quantity of usufructs will be distributed to the villagers under the supervision of Forest Guard (Member Secretary). 25% of the net sale proceeds of final harvest will be given to the VFDC out of the plantations/ coppice so raised and kept in a common fund of the committee known as Village Development Fund which can be utilized for village development works with the approval of General House and in consultation with the concerned DFO. The exercise of other rights viz. timber, fuelwood etc. will be exerciseable as per provisions of settlements.

X) Notification No.FFE.B-A (10)-1/2009 dated Shimla-2, the 4th March, 2014

(Rates of relief due to losses caused to human beings and domestic livestock by the wild animals)

In supersession of all previous Notification on the subject cited above, the Governor Himachal Pradesh is pleased to declare the categories of losses caused by Wild animals (as defined in Wildlife Protection Act, 1972) and the amount of relief as under:-

In case of death of human beings	1,50,000/-
In case of permanent disability to human being	1,00,000/-
In case of grievous injuries/ partial disability to human being	75,000/-
In case of simple injury to human being as per actual cost of medical treatment subject to maximum	10,000/-
In case of loss of Horse, Mule, Buffalo, Ox, Yak and Camel.	10,000/-
In case of loss of Cow, Jersey and Cross Breed	6,000/-
In case of loss of Cow (Local Breed) Donkey Churu, Churi and Pashmina Goat.	3,000/-
In case of loss of Sheep, Goat and Pig	1,500/-

In case of loss of young ones of Buffalo, Cow Jersey and all other Breeds, Mule, Yak, Horse, Kamal, Churu, Churi, Donkey, Pesmina Goat, Sheep and Goat	1,000/-
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The grant of relief as referred to above will be subject to the following conditions:-

- I. Production of postmortem report in case of loss of human life, certificate in case of Grievous injury, partial and permanent disability and prescription slip as well as verification of actual cost of medical treatment in case of simple injury (including monkey bites).from the medical officer of a Government Institution, Government recognized Medical Institutu in as the case may be.
- II. The verification of loss of cattle that the same was actually caused by wild animals can be done by the pradhan/ UP Pradhan of Panchayat/ Revenue Lambardar/ President notified area committee/ Chairman Municipal Committee Commissioner, Municipal Corporation of the area/ elected member of the Cantonment Board area/ Conciler of the area and the Range Officer Deputy Range Officer or any other forest officer higher in rank than a Range Officer, Veterinary Officer or Veterinary Pharmacist or officer authorized by Veterinary officer of the area.
- III. All Divisional Forest Officer in H.P. shall be the final authority to sanction cases of claim on account of losses done by the wild animals.
- IV. The DFO's shall release 25% of the amount of the relief prescribed of human loss/ permanent and partial disability/ grievous injury of receipt of report as intrim relief. Immediately to the family of the deceased/ affected person after due verification in anticipation of formal sanction without delay. The balance amount will be released after receipt of the complete relief claim.
- V. All claims in respect of simple injury to human shall be restricted to actual cost of medical treatment verified by the Medical Officer of a Government Institution/ Govt. recognized Medical institution subject to maximum of Rupees 10,000/- as prescribed above in the categories of losses.
- VI. All case of losses caused by the Wild Animals should be reported by the applicant to the nearest Forest Office with in thirty days of incident and claims for relief is filed three months to the nearest forest office under control of Divisional Forest Officer (Territorial or Wildlife). The claim can be filed either at

the place where the loss by wild animals has occurred/ reported or where the applicant resides. All time barred cases shall be sent to GoHP for approval.

VII. The relief will be granted in case of loss of live stock to the owner of the live stock.

VIII. The relief in case of loss of the human being will be granted in the order of preference given below:-

- a) Wife or Husband, as the case may be.
- b) Sons and married or unmarried daughter and children of predeceased sons (equal share).
- c) Daughter (equal share).
- d) Grand children being children of the sons or daughter who died before him (equal share).
- e) Father and Mother.
- f) Failing all above any other next of kin entitled to a share in the estate.
- g) Brothers or Sisters or children of the deceased brothers (equal share).

All the prescribed rates shall be effective shall be 1st April 2014 onwards.

Whereas, the draft of the Himachal Pradesh Forest (Timber Distribution to the Right Holders) Rules, 2013 were published in the Rajpatra, Himachal Pradesh vide this Department notification of even number dated 28.09.2013 for inviting objection(s) and suggestion(s) from the general public within a period of 30 days from the date of its publication in the Rajpatra, Himachal Pradesh, as required under clause (L) of section 32 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (16 of 1927);

And whereas, the objection(s) and suggestion(s) received within the above stipulated period have been considered;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (L) of section 32 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (16 of 1927), the Governor, Himachal Pradesh is pleased to make the following rules, namely:-

1.Short Title and commencement.-(1) These rules may be called the Himachal Pradesh Forest (Timber Distribution to the Right Holders) Rules, 2013.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of publication in the Rajpatra, Himachal Pradesh.

2. Definitions.-(1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,

(a) 'Act' means the Indian Forest Act, 1927;

(b) 'Right Holder' means a person who has a right of timber recorded in the 'record of rights' in the Forest Settlement Report of the area concerned;

(c) 'Record of rights' means, rights recorded in the Forest Settlement Reports;

(d) 'Timber Distribution' means distribution of timber to the right holders as per record of rights recorded in the Forest Settlement Reports; and

(e) 'Timber Distribution Rights' means right of a Right Holder having cultivable lands for grant of timber for construction, repair and addition or alteration of residential house and cow shed for bonafide domestic use of the Right Holder, recorded in the Forest Settlement Report of the area concerned;

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(2) All other words and expressions used but not defined in these rules shall have the same meaning as assigned to them in the Indian Forest Act, 1927.

3. Entitlement.-Timber shall be granted to the Right Holders who have their recorded rights in the concerned Forest Settlement Reports for grant of Timber for construction, repair and addition or alteration of residential house, cow sheds for bonafide domestic use:

Provided that:

- (i) no Timber Distribution under these rules shall be made for ten years if the right holder has sold trees yielding timber for construction of houses from his private land holding;
- (ii) in case right holder has land holding which qualifies him for grant of timber at more than one place, he may be granted timber at both places but the rates of trees shall be doubled at the second place. The right holder shall give undertaking about the details of land holdings and while applying for Timber Distribution at second place, details of timber already obtained against land at first place;
- (iii) no Timber Distribution shall be granted to a land owner on the basis of land purchased after obtaining the permission of the Government under section 118 of the Tenancy and Land Reforms Act, 1972, irrespective of the date of purchase of such land;
- (iv) timber shall be granted only to the head of the family as per the Panchayat records;
- (v) timber shall be granted for the construction, repair and addition or alteration of house and cow shed to be used only for bonafide domestic purposes;
- (vi) timber shall not be granted to the Right Holders, if trees for the purpose are not available silviculturally in the forest where concerned right holders have Timber Distribution right. However, in such cases trees may be given from other forests at 50 % of market rate of trees; provided right holders of those forests have no objection;
- (vii) rights other than for timber for construction, repair and addition or alteration as contained in forest settlement reports shall continue to be exercised by the right holders;
- (viii) Timber Distribution Rights shall be subject to active cooperation and participation of Right Holders in forest conservancy. In case any Right Holder fails to perform his duties for apprehending offenders, extinguishing fire or commits any forest offence, his right of Timber Distribution shall be suspended for sixteen years from the date of omission or commission of such offence; and

(ix) Timber Distribution Right of a Right Holder shall be suspended for sixteen years if he is found to have mis-utilized the timber obtained in Timber Distribution under these rules.

4. Quantity.-(1) Trees shall be granted in unconverted form tree as per scale fixed below:

- (i) for construction of new house = Up to 7 Cubic Meter standing volume; and
- (ii) for repair and addition or alteration = Up to 3 Cubic Meter standing volume.

(2) Trees shall be given from salvage (fallen, dry standing) trees. If salvage trees are not available, then only silviculturally available green trees shall be given.

5. Periodicity. -The periodicity for grant of Timber Distribution to the Right Holders shall be as under:

- (i) for new construction - once in fifteen years;
- (ii) for repair and addition or alteration - once in five years;
- (iii) sufferers of natural calamities/fire sufferers: as recommended by the Sub Divisional Officer (Civil) concerned and after personal verification by the Assistant Conservator of Forest/Divisional Forest Officer concerned subject to the condition that the grant shall not exceed the maximum limit specified under rule-4; and
- (iv) period shall be counted from the date on which TD was granted last.

6. Rates. -The rates shall be charged as under:-

- (i) Rs. 500 per Cubic Meter standing volume for Deodar and Rs. 250 per Cubic Meter standing volume for other species;
- (ii) Right Holders suffering from natural calamities shall be given trees free of cost;
- (iii) Rates once fixed shall remain valid for five years.

7. Procedure for grant of trees.-Application for grant of trees shall be submitted by Right Holder as per **Annexure-I** to the Panchayat concerned after getting necessary remarks from the Patwari concerned about his land holding and rights. The Pradhan of concerned Gram Panchayat after ascertaining genuineness of the requirements of the Right Holder shall give his recommendations indicating actual quantity of requirement of timber. Thereafter, right holder shall submit his application to the Forest Guard of the area who shall enter the same in the register maintained for the purpose and shall

acknowledge the receipt of the application to the Right Holder and shall send the application with his recommendations to the Block Officer after ascertaining the genuineness of demand, who in turn shall submit the application along with his recommendations to the Range Officer. The Range Officer shall forward the same with his recommendations to the Divisional Forest Officer. After receipt of application from the Range Officer, the Divisional Forest Officer shall take action for sanctioning of the trees after satisfying himself about the genuineness of the requirements and silviculturally availability of trees in the concerned forest and intimate his decision to the Right Holder concerned as per **Annexure-II** appended to these rules.

8. Verification by Divisional Forest Officer.- Divisional Forest Officer shall randomly verify the actual requirements of trees applied for before according sanction.

9. Jurisdiction and period for the use of Timber.- (1) Timber obtained in Timber Distribution scheme shall be utilised within the same Revenue Estate, where his rights exist. Trees granted under these rules shall be allowed to be carried within revenue estate without obtaining any permission after affixing of TD hammer:

Provided that in case the timber is to be carried out from one estate to another, the Right Holder shall have to obtain permission from the Range Officer concerned for this purpose:

(2) The timber granted shall be utilized by the Right Holder within a period of one year. If the trees granted are not utilized within the specified period, concerned Divisional Forest Officer may grant extension for their use based on the genuineness of the case. The Divisional Forest Officer shall ensure through his staff that the trees granted are used for the purpose for which they were sanctioned. In case Timber obtained is not utilized during the permissible period, the same may be seized/confiscated by the Forest Department and the decision taken by the Divisional Forest Officer in this regard shall be final.

10. Marking of trees.- After sanctioning of trees by the Divisional Forest Officer, they shall be marked by Block Officer.

11. Use of Saw for conversion.- Conversion of trees, marked in Timber Distribution, shall be converted by using saw.

12. Another tree in lieu of rotten tree.- If salvage trees marked in Timber Distribution are found totally rotten after conversion, the right holder may inform the Range Officer, who shall personally check and certify and send report to the Divisional Forest Officer.

Thereafter, another tree may be ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer to be marked in lieu of rotten tree.

13. Monitoring of data base and checking.-The data regarding details of right holders, information about land at two places by the right holders, tree/timber granted, utilized, etc. Shall be maintained and monitored Panchayat and Range wise by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned through the Officers and officials working under him.

14. Penalty and Punishment.- If any Right Holder, violates any provision of these Rules in utilization of timber obtained, his rights shall be suspended for next sixteen years and he shall also be liable to pay the cost of the tree at the market rate.

15. Repeal and savings.-(1) The Himachal Pradesh Forest (Timber Distribution to the Right Holders) Rules, 2010 are hereby repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding such repeal or any action taken or anything done under the rules so repealed shall be deemed to have been taken or done under the corresponding provisions of these rules.



Appendix – XIV

HP Forest (Transit Rules) 26.11.2013

(Authoritative English Text of this Department Notification No. FFE-B-A(3)-2/2013, dated ²⁶⁻¹---
-as required under clause (3) of article 348 of the Constitution of India)

NOTIFICATION

No. FFE-B-A(3)-2/2013 Dated: Shimla-171 002, the 26-11-2013.

In exercise of the powers conferred under sections 41 and 42 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (XVI of 1927), the Governor, Himachal Pradesh is pleased to make the following rules to regulate the movement of Forest Produce by land routes into, from and within the territorial limits of the Himachal Pradesh, namely:-

1. **Short title, extent and commencement.**- (1) These rules may be called the Himachal Pradesh Forest Produce Transit (Land Routes) Rules, 2013;

(2) They shall apply to the whole of the State of Himachal Pradesh;

(3) They shall come into force forthwith;

2. **Definitions.**- (1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-

- (a) 'Act' means the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (XVI of 1927);
- (b) 'section' means a section of the said Act;
- (c) 'Division' means an executive forest management unit of forests constituted for the purpose of administration of forests and notified as such by the Government;
- (d) 'Divisional Forest Officer' means an Officer holding the charge of the concerned division;
- (e) 'Conservator of Forests' means an Officer holding the charge of the concerned forest circle; and
- (f) 'Check Post' means any post so specified under the provisions of these rules for checking and regulating the movement of forest produce.

(2) All other words and expression used but not defined in these rules shall have the same meaning as assigned to them in the Act.

3. **Transportation with property mark(s).**- No person shall transport or cause to be transported any forest produce other than fuelwood, Khairwood, bamboos, charcoal, medicinal plants, *grass, other plant parts including bark, leaves, stem, roots, flowers, fruits, cones*, and seeds that does not bear the imprint of the registered mark.

4. **Registration of property mark and its use.** - (1) All persons willing to transport forest produce other than under rule 3 by land routes shall register at the office of the Divisional Forest Officer the mark or marks which indicate their propriety rights in such forest produce; provided that no mark is required to be imprinted on any timber which is being transported within the concerned revenue estate only by a right holder in consequence of a grant to that effect in his favour.

(2) No person shall be allowed to register any mark(s) already registered in favour of other persons or the Department. The Divisional Forest Officer may refuse registration of any mark

(s) which according to him closely resemble(s) used by the Government Department or has/ have been registered in favour of some other person(s).

5. **Issue of certificate of registration.**- A certificate showing the facsimile or the mark, the date of registration, the period for which it is valid and acknowledging the payment of fees shall be issued to every person registering his mark (s).

6. **Validity period of registration Certificate.**- Every certificate of registration shall be valid for three years commencing from the date of registration. The registration fee in respect of each mark shall be Rs. 500 and if the number of marks to be registered in favour of one person exceeds three, the fee shall be Rs. 1000/- for each such additional mark. However, no fee is payable by any Government Department.

7. **Issue of pass for Export or transport of Forest Produce.**- No pass shall be issued for any unmarked forest produce other than fuelwood, khairwood, bamboos, charcoal, medicinal plants, grass, other plant parts including bark, leaves, stem, roots, flowers, fruits, cones and seeds as bears the marks not registered as herein after provided:-

- (i) the Divisional Forest Officer may refuse to issue a pass for export or transport if he has reasons to believe or for any other valid reasons that the forest produce has not been legally obtained by the applicant. However, the refusal to issue a pass shall be made in the shape of self-speaking written order; and
- (ii) the person who has been refused the issue of pass may within fifteen days of the date of refusal prefer an appeal to the Chief Conservator/Conservator of Forests incharge of the area concerned and his orders on appeal shall be final.

8. **Prohibition on transport of Forest Produce.**- (1) No person shall transport or cause to be transported any forest produce, except that obtained from plant species specified in and obtained in accordance with provisions contained in Schedule - 'I' of Annexure-D by land routes, without obtaining pass (Annexure-'A') from the concerned Divisional Forest Officer or any officer or person so authorized.

Explanation for the purposes of rule 8: Divisional Forest Officer shall include an officer holding the charge of the Division from where the forest produce has been extracted under contractual agreement.

(2) No such pass shall be issued in case of forest produce obtained from species declared as prohibited or banned for collection or harvesting under any law (Act, Rule or Order) applicable in the State except when such collection is carried out as per specific provisions provided in that Act, Rule or order.

(3) No person shall transport or cause to be transported any timber for conversion for sawing or for sale en route.

(4) No person shall transport or cause to be transported any timber except firewood, pulpwood, bamboo and that obtained from plant species listed in and obtained in accordance with provisions contained in Schedule - 'I' of Annexure -D unless the timber is properly affixed with an export hammer mark by the forest officer authorized by the Conservator of Forests concerned.

9. *Transport Routes and other conditions.*- (1) The authority issuing the pass shall specify a route by which *alone* the forest produce may be transported for export outside Himachal Pradesh in such a manner that the forest produce crosses through one of the following barriers established by the Excise and Taxation Department:-

Provided that such authority shall also specify the check post(s) where the forest produce shall be compulsory checked en-route:

Provided further that no timber or other forest produce from any forest depot or intermediate depot or first station/ depot of dispatch shall be loaded in vehicles, trollies, bullock carts etc. after sun-set and before sun rise. The Divisional Forest Officer concerned may further impose any restriction(s) if so warranted for controlling the movement of the forest produce after sun-set and before sun-rise.

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(2) In case the produce is not to be exported outside the territory of Himachal Pradesh, the authority issuing the pass shall specify the route by which alone the forest produce may be transported and shall also determine the check post(s) where it shall be compulsory checked.

(3) The issuing authority shall also determine the other conditions subject to which the pass shall be issued and shall also determine the period for which the pass shall remain valid. However, the validity of any pass shall under no circumstances exceed a period of Six months including any extension(s) allowed. A fee of Rs. 100/- shall be leviable for the issue of such pass:

Provided that the export pass fee @ Rs 200/- per quintal shall be levied in case of resin to be exported outside the State of Himachal Pradesh:

Provided that permit fee in case of forest produce obtained from species listed in **Schedule-II of Annexure-"D"**, shall be as specified in it:

Provided that permit fee in respect of forest produce obtained from species, including that listed in **Schedule-II of Annexure-"D"**, cultivated on private land in accordance with provisions contained in **Schedule III of Annexure-"D"** shall be Rs. 100/-:

Provided further that in respect of medicinal plants as included in **Schedule-II of Annexure-"D"**, purported to be transported to the notified Herbal/ Agricultural Mandis, permit fee shall be levied in accordance with procedure detailed in **Annexure-"E"**.

10. Issue of Challan (s).- The person in whose favour the pass has been issued or his authorized Agent shall carry a challan (**Annexure- 'B'**) to accompany the forest produce in case all the forest produce cannot be transported at the same time and the pass cannot accompany the forest produce. The challan will be valid for a maximum 60 hours.

11. Setting up of check post (s).- (1) The Divisional Forest Officer may with the permission of the Conservator of Forests notify the setting up of a check post or check posts at suitable point(s) for purposes of check and examination of forest produce.

(2) At every check post, registers (**Annexure-C**) to record the details of forest produce passing through the check post shall be maintained.

12. Production of pass/challan for examination.- Forest Officer or Police Officer may at any time require any person transporting forest produce to produce the pass/challan as issued for the transportation of such produce. No person is entitled to transport forest produce by virtue of pass/challan which he does not himself held but is or is stated to be in the hands of some other person.

13. Detention of Forest Produce and other articles etc.- In the event of the pass/challan not being produced, the Forest Officer or Police Officer may detain the Forest Produce, vehicle, camels, mules etc. by which it was being transported and cause the same not to move as long as may be reasonably necessary to examine the forest produce and/or till the valid pass/challan is produced.

14. Seizure of Forest Produce and other articles etc.- In the event of the pass/challan being not produced, the Forest Officer or Police Officer shall seize the forest produce and means of transport and other articles, in accordance with the law in force.

15. *Exemption to right holders obtaining of pass.*- Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, a right-holder who has collected forest produce in exercise of his recorded rights may, without obtaining a pass transport such forest produce within the revenue estate in which it has been so collected:

Provided that no timber will be removed from the forests unless checked and hammer marked and detail of timber extracted written on the overleaf of the permit by the forest officer authorized in this behalf.

16. *Bar on booking of forest produce by rail, by post and by air.*- No. person shall offer any forest produce for export by rail on any railway station or by post at any post office or by air on any airport within Himachal Pradesh unless it is covered by the pass issued under these rules and nor Railway, Postal, Airport authority shall accept any forest produce for transport/transmission by rail, post or air, unless it is accompanied by a valid pass.

17. *Bar on altering or defacing of marks.*- No person shall without the written permission of the Divisional Forest Officer alter or deface or obliterate any mark placed on any forest produce while in transit.

18. *Penalty for breach of rules.*- Any person who contravene these rules shall be liable to imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or with fine which may extend to rupees Five thousand or with both and the forest produce being transported may also be seized and dealt with under the provisions of the Indian Forest Act:

Provided that the penalties will be doubled in cases where the offence has been committed after sun-set or before sun-rise, or after resistance to the lawful authority or where the offender has been previously convicted for similar offence.

19. *Repeal and Savings.*-(1) On and from the date of commencement of these rules, the Himachal Pradesh Forest Produce Transit (Land Routes) Rules, 1978 are hereby repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken under the rules so repealed, shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provisions of these rules.

The removal and transportation of the forest produce obtained from plants species listed in this schedule and growing on private lands shall be in accordance with the following provisions:

- (i) The landowner shall intimate in writing to the concerned Range Forest Officer through the local Forest Guard of his intent to harvest the forest produce from plant species listed in this schedule along with estimate of yield before starting the harvest.
- (ii) The Range Forest Officer may himself or through his representative inspect the land from which such harvest is proposed and verify the yield.
- (iii) Range Forest Officer shall issue a letter to the landowner giving detail of forest produce obtained from private land.
- (iv) The landowner shall carry this letter during transportation of the verified produce.

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Schedule- III

General Provisions relating to Registration of Grower, Cultivation of Medicinal Plants on Private Land and Transportation of Produce so Obtained

A. Registration of Growers for Cultivation of Medicinal Plants:

1. Every grower intending to cultivate medicinal plants listed in Schedule-'II' on his/ her private land shall get himself/ herself registered with the concerned Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) by paying a registration fee of Rs. 100/-. For this purpose, the grower will submit completed applications in the specified format given in Schedule-III(A), in duplicate, alongwith registration fee to the Deputy Ranger of the concerned block, who will (i) return one copy to the grower after acknowledging the receipt of application, and (ii) submit the application to the concerned Range Forest Officer (RFO) for getting registered with the DFO. After registration, the Forest Guard will hand over the registration certificates, in the given format given in Schedule-III(B), to the applicant, within one month of submission of application.

2. Applicant shall submit registered power of attorney alongwith application for registration in case the land is not in his name.

3. The registration shall be valid only in respect of the species for which registration has been obtained.

4. Registration shall be valid for a period of five years from the date of registration, after which it would need to be re-registered.

B. Cultivation of Medicinal Plants:

1. The growers shall inform the concerned RFO through the local Forest Guard about the medicinal plant species cultivated by him/ her on his/ her private land within one month of sowing/ planting.

2. The grower shall procure seed/ germplasm for cultivation from certified sources only and shall not collect/ remove the same from wild resources, unless permitted in writing by the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO).

3. The grower shall get the khasra-wise land details bearing medicinal plant cultivation entered in the revenue records for the year.

4. The Range Forest Officer (RFO) or his representative may visit the fields under medicinal plant cultivation within the gestation period and certify the extent and quality such crop.

5. The grower shall inform the Range Forest Officer through the local Forest Guard about the time of harvest (i) at least one month in advance, and (ii) immediately after harvest.

6. The grower shall make the necessary records pertaining to the medicinal plant cultivation on his/ her land available to the RFO or his representative to facilitate verification of cultivation.
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C. Transportation of Produce Obtained from Cultivated Sources:

1. The grower or his authorized person shall transport the material after obtaining necessary transit pass under these Rules from the Divisional Forest Officer.

2. Other regulations to transport the cultivated produce shall be as per the provisions of these rules.

D. Penalty, etc. for Violation of Provisions:

In case of violation of provisions contained in this annexure, the registration shall be cancelled and produce shall be seized and further action shall be taken as per law.

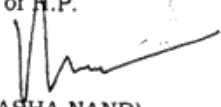

I am to refer to your office letter No. Ft.785-13/63-(M)-Van-Sarkar dated 30th June, 1999 and 26th July, 1999 on the above subject and to say that from the Notification No. Rev-D(A)-12-16/94 dated 11.3.1999 by the Revenue Department it is clear that by deletion of entries of “Khudro Drakhtan – Malkiyat Sarkar” from the Khanna Kafiya of the Jamabandis by special revision, the land owners also become the owners of the trees standing thereon for all intents and purposes. In view of this in order to implement the Government decision in letter and spirit the requests of the owners of the trees for extraction of the same may be dealt as under:-

1. The Provision of the Himachal Pradesh Land Preservation Act, 1978 and Rules made there under shall apply in cases which are not covered under paras (ii) and (iii) below.

ii) The cases where the classification of the land on which the trees are standing is “DPF” extraction of trees shall not be allowed.

iii) In cases where the classification of land, in the revenue record, on which the trees are standing, is “Van” and it is expected that land use shall change after extraction of trees, provisions of section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 shall apply.

NORMS FOR SALVAGE MARKING

Copy of memo no. No. Ft. 116 – 84/71 (S) Part. Addl. Mob. Dated 26-11-1997

Jai Hind.

Reference this office memo number 112-2/71 (S) dated 22-07-1993.

Instances are coming to the notice of this office where green trees were marked as Salvage markings contrary to the instructions issued from this office from time to time. This is very serious.

In view of the Hon'ble Supreme Court interim order dated 12.12.1996 passed in Wrti Petition (Civil) No. 202/95 Shri T.N. Godavarman Thirumalkpad Versus Union of India and others, only marking of dry standing, dry fallen etc. trees are to be done for felling in areas in all the forest (except the Wildlife Sanctuary and National Park areas) notified under Section 18 & 35 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 as per the norms fixed by the Expert Committee. The Ecpert Committee has fixed the following qualitative and quantitative norms for making of dry standing/ fallen trees through the H.P.S.F.C. Ltd. As under:

1. "Half broken and top broken green trees will not be marked under salvage marking in order to form bio mass in Forest.
2. With regard to fixation of qualitative norms, the following kind of trees will be marked by the Forest Departmrnt and removed by the H.P.S.F.C. Ltd. :-
 - i) Fallen
 - ii) Dry
3. So far as fixation of quantitative norms is concerned whatever quantity of fallen & dry trees is available the same is to be removed and no specific quantity can be fixed except that yield where prescribed under the Working Plans shall not be exceeded".

You are, therefore, requested to please mark dry standing & dry fallen trees only in salvage marking strictly in accordance with the qualitative & quantitative norms fixed by the Expert Committee as above. It may please also be noted that before handing over the salvage lots for working to the forest corporation, necessary inspection of the markings may be ensured to be carried out by the respective Forest functionaries as prescribed vide various instructions to check and contain any chances of marking of green trees in salvage markings. These instructions may please be complied in letter and spirit and any laxity in this regard will be viewed seriously.

As no green trees can be felled, therefore, the requirement of fuelwood is to be met out of the salvage marking of dry trees only. ‘THE BURNING OF SLASH’
OF
H.P. FOREST MANUAL
VOLUME IV

7.1 Forest Sanitation:

The proper sanitation of the forest is just as important as that of the town. Diseases of fungi and attacks of insects are spread by decaying wood. A little of slash adds enormously to the fire hazard and by covering the ground, it prevents the seed from reaching the soil. The only real remedy against epidemics of insects is cleanliness in forests and proper attention to silvicultural operations, whereby the trees are kept in vigorous growing condition. The burning of slash was introduced in the State sometimes in the beginning of twentieth century when natural regeneration under the uniform method first began to receive attention and this work has now become a matter of routine in practically every division. In the past wherever a mass of rotting wood was left lying on the ground in regeneration areas the result usually was that such areas were destroyed by fire. It is a standing order that regeneration areas are to be kept clean and all slash of the seeding felling collected and burnt if no other use can be made of the debris. Sometimes this can be sold for firewood; very often neighbouring villagers are glad to remove it in which case they should be given a reasonable time to collect what they want before departmental burning is commenced. The principals underlying the collection and disposal of slash may be summarised as follows:-

- i) Start collection from the top of the compartment and work downhill.
- ii) Lop the branches, roll logs away from seed bearers and stack larger slash by hand in open places in moderate heaps of about 20 Qtls. Each.
- iii) Rake the chips and humus downhill on to the heaps of slash.
- iv) Burn the heaps downhill.

7.2 Collection and Disposal of Slash:

The smoke does not interfere with the men working below and there is less risk of fire.

Burn the heaps in rotation to reduce the heat. Women and boys can be employed on raking up the smaller chips. One Forest Guard can hardly control more than 6 labourers and the same man should be employed year after year. A great saving in cost can be effected by attention to the details of how the work is done. For instance it is easier to throw branches downhill than to carry them uphill. It has been found that in the case of chir pine, logs are the most dangerous form of slash and these must be disposed of. For piling the most economical unit is a gang of 6 men. These should be armed with 3 levers 2.8 long and 3 axes. The logs should be levered downhill away from the seed bearers and regeneration to the nearest open place where they can be burnt in small heaps. Piling gangs have nothing to do with firing.

7.3 Provided the logs are dry, they can be completely burnt without splitting or cutting by covering them the branches and smaller felling refuse. The work of their complete destruction can, if necessary, be completed in two operations; first fire the pile green one, this will render it much less inflammable and in the following autumn burn again when the logs will be completely consumed.

7.4 Time of Slash burning:

The proper time for the collection and burning of slash in chil pine forests is the winter. In the higher hills collection can go on from the melting of the snow and burning is best done in October and November as the risk of damage at that time is very much less. Also a good seed bed is available for immediate sowing. Burning in June should generally be avoided; as accidents have occurred due to burning slash at this time. However in very wet fir forests may be necessary to burn in June, in which case special precautions will be taken. Under all circumstances the strictest attention must be paid to the preservation of the mother trees. Chil will stand a good deal of heat, deodar less, kail still less and silver fir will not stand any at all. The subordinate in charge of the work is responsible for the safety of the mother trees and the forest. In chir forests after burning the heaps of slash a fire may be run downhill over the whole compartment under the same orders and procedure as in the departmental burning in chir forest. This will finally clean up the area ready for natural regeneration. Steps will of course be taken to see that chir advance growth or pole crops retained as part of the future crops are not damaged in any way by this operation. As mentioned above silver fir is very susceptible to fire hazard and there is a serious risk of the trees being scorched unless the greatest care is exercised in debris burning.

7.5 Considerable attention has lately been paid to the humus layer of the forest floor and its effect on success in natural regeneration. There is hardly any doubt that the failure of regeneration in the

high lying forests, especially in the case of spruce and silver fir, is due to the large accumulation of undecomposed litter. In all operations connected with slash disposal therefore an effort should be made to get rid of as much of this litter as possible by ranking it up with the smaller chips and burning it on the heaps of slash. It is recognized that once regeneration has been obtained the slash from the secondary fellings cannot be burnt. All the same it should receive attention and every effort to made get rid of it. In some cases it has been piled on the stumps of felled trees or thrown in to nullahs. Owing to great differences in the amount of slash obtained in secondary fellings and the varying nature of the existing reproduction and local conditions each compartment must be treated on its merits.

7.6 It has already been ordered that slash from unsaleable thinning is not be left lying about on the forest floor. In most cases less harm is done by leaving trees standing than by felling them and littering the forest with refuse which not only encourages insects but constitutes a continual menace from fire. Steps should be taken to make it a condition of sales of trees locally or to right holders or of grants to free grantees that these people collect their refuse in to heaps or remove it from the forest. In road work a mass of inflammable rubbish is often thrown immediately below the road which is not only most unsightly but constitutes a menace from fire. In short, Divisional Forest Officers, Forest Rangers and all ranks of the staff will conduct all their operations with a view to cleanliness and the proper sanitation and protection of the forest estate from fire.

COPY OF SUMMARY OF CONCLUSION OF THE TEAM CONSISTING OF Sh. R.P. KHOSLA. IAS (Retd.) AND Sh. S. PARAMESWARAPPA, IFS (Retd.) CONSTITUTED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA REGARDING FIRE CONTROL IN FOREST AREAS VIDE OFFICE MEMORANDUM NO.A.34011/6/95-FF DATED 11TH JULY, 1995.

CHAPTER – VIII – SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS

AREA AFFECTED BY FIRE:-

i) Data regarding the fire affected area obtained through satellite imagery was used to cross check the data furnished by the State Government.

ii) In Uttar Pradesh the data furnished by the State Government pertained only to the reserve forests. No data was available regarding the fire affected area in Civil and Panchayat Forests which comprise 31% of the forest area in the hills. Calculations of the affected area in these categories of forests had therefore to be done through sample checks and extrapolation of other data.

iii) The proximity of Civil and Panchayat forests to village habitations, their varietal composition and the absence of any organized agency for their protection has resulted in a much higher percentage of such areas being affected by fire than in reserve forest.

iv) The total area affected by fire has been estimated as follows:

CAUSES OF FIRES:

- i) The intense and prolonged heat and the virtual absence of rain in May and June in the hill areas of U.P. and Himachal Pradesh brought about a situation where the pine needles and other undergrowth in the forest areas became dry and highly combustible.
- ii) The heat also resulted in the fall of an unusually heavy quantity of pine needles in the areas under pine forest, thus increasing substantially the combustible material lying in the forest.
- iii) The ban of green fellings together with the totally inadequate provision of funds for fire prevention measures resulted in the normal forestry practices for the fire protection of the forest such as controlled burning, cleaning of fire lines etc. being discontinued.
- iv) A large number of fires originated from the road side and were caused by the negligence of travelers and other visitors to the forest who discarded lighted matches and cigarette butts in the highly combustible beds of pine needles.
- v) Fires were also caused by villagers setting fire to their agricultural fields for clearing dry material and to their pasture areas to bring about a regeneration of fresh grass. These fires then spread to the contiguous forests.
- vi) Fires were sometimes caused by rivalry among resin contractors.
- (vii) There is no evidence to indicate that the timber mafia was responsible for setting fire to the forest or benefited from it in any way.
- (viii) There appears to be no truth in the allegation that the Forest Department Officials deliberately set fire to the forests in order to cover up their failure to do plantation work.

EXTENT OF DAMAGE TO FOREST WEALTH:

- i) The fires caused extensive damage to plantations. Damage was also caused to standing trees resulting in driage and in loss of normal increment.
- ii) Considerable damage was also caused to resin blazes.
- iii) The valuation of damage which is capable of qualification has been assessed as follows:

- iv) In addition to the quantifiable loss indicated above, there has been loss on account of loss of annual increment, loss in fertility of soil, soil erosion, loss of employment due to damage to resin channels, drying up or water sources.
- v) The FRI should undertake studies for proper assessment of all aspects of damage resulting from forest fires.

MEASURES OF PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF FIRE:

- i) Increased vigilance is necessary by by appointment of an adequate number of fire watchers during the month of April, May and June as used to be the practice earlier.
- ii) Clearing and maintenance of fire lines which has been virtually abandoned due to a shortage of funds must be carried out regularly.

- iii) The practice of controlled burning to deal with the accumulation of combustible pine needles on the forest floor which has been abandoned as a result of shortage of funds has to be re – introduced.
- iv) Proper forest management and silvicultural practice particularly in pine forest which have been abandoned as a result of the imposition of the ban on the green felling must be reintroduced to ensure proper health and protection of the forest. For this purpose, ban on felling of pine should immediately be revoked and the forests worked as per working plans.
- v) Efforts for finding alternative user for pine needles should be supported by the Government so as to demonstrate their economic viability. This will help reduce the accumulation of combustible material in the forest floor.
- vi) The forest department staff should be provided with a complete communication network through wireless to enable a quick response in dealing with forest fires and also with the problems of illicit felling.
- (vii) The communication network has to be supported with improved mobility to enable quick transport of men and materials from one area to another. For this at least one additional jeep may be provided at the divisional level to the D.F.O. in the hill areas.
- (viii) Where villagers do not come to assist the forest department in extinguishing forest fires their timber rights should be curtailed if not forfeited.
- ix) The state Government must ensure that adequate funds are provided to the forest department for the proper care, maintenance and protection of the forest. The steady reduction in such funds has seriously affected the activities of the Forest Department. These funds should be provided through a centrally sponsored scheme for this purpose.

A LONG TERM STRATEGY:

- i) Existing forest management policies have to change to a more participative pattern of forest management in which village communities are more deeply involved.
- ii) The Civil forests in Uttar Pradesh which today are no one's responsibility should be converted in to Panchayat Forests as rapidly as possible and placed under the supervision of the Forest Department.
- iii) The forest panchayat rules should be amended to ensure that the villages have more effective control over their forest and derive tangible benefits from them.
- iv) Mahila Mandals should be actively promoted and supported by the Forest Department as an agency for the care and protection of the forests.
- v) Integrated forestry development programmes should be adopted as the principal pattern of land related development programme in the hills.
- vi) The genuine need of villagers for timber must be met. Additional quantities over and above their rights can be supplied to them as PD subject to a careful verification of the genuineness of their requirements. The additional timber required for the purpose can easily be met from a removal of the ban on green fellings in pine forests.
- (vii) The forest department should be strengthened to enable it to discharge its traditional functions in the reserved forests more effectively. Beat sizes should be reduced, vehicles and wireless sets provided and personnel management improved.
- (viii) Development responsibilities through adoption of integrated multi disciplinary programmes covering forestry, animals husbandry, soil conservation, fodder development, drinking water and fuel saving should be assigned to the forest department.

AUTHORITATIVE ENGLISH TEXT OF THIS DEPARTMENT NOTIFICATION No. FFE-A© 7-1/96-II DATED 17.11.1999 AS REQUIRED UNDER CLAUSE (3) OF ARTICLE 348 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

**GOVERNMENT OF HIMACHAL PRADESH FOREST DEPARTMENT
NOTIFICATION**

No. FFE-A© 7-1/96-II Dated Shimla-2, the 17-11-1999.

In the exercise of the powers conferred by clause (h) of Section 32 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (Act No. XVI of 1927), the Governor, Himachal Pradesh is pleased to make the following rules, namely:- (1.) Short title, commencement and application: (1) These rules may be called the Himachal Pradesh Forests (Protection from Fire) Rules, 1999. (2) These rules shall come into force from the date of publication in the Rajpatra, Himachal Pradesh. (3) These rules shall be applicable through out the year except for the period from 1st of July to 13th of September. 2. Definitions: (1) In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in subject or context, (a) “Act” means the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (XVI of 1927); (b) “Divisional Forest Officer” means, (i) Divisional Forest Officer of a Forest Division. (ii) Divisional Manager of the Himachal Pradesh State Forest Corporation Ltd., and (iii) Collector (in whose justification in forest lies); (c) “Forest” means a reserved forest or protected forest, duly notified as such under the Act; (d) “Section” means section of act; and (e) “Schedule” means Schedule appended to these Rules.

2) The words and expressions used, but not defined in these rules, shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Act.

3) Prohibition of kindling of Fire:- (1) Kindling of fire within one hundred meters from a forest without permission of the Divisional Forest Officer, or his authorized representative shall be prohibited. (2) Any person lighting a fire even beyond on hundred meter from the boundary of a forest shall take precautions, by clearing a fire path, not less than 10 meters in width between such place and such boundary, or by employing watchers or otherwise, to prevent the fire from spreading.

4) Precautions to be taken in burning agriculture residue bushes or “ghasnies” near forest. No person shall ignite agriculture residue or set fire to “ghasnies”, or clear by fire any land, within a

distance of one hundred meter from the boundary of the forest, unless; (a) he gives notice of his intention to burn or clear the land by fire, at least one week before doing so, to the nearest Forest Range Officer under whose jurisdiction such land lies; and (b) there is between such boundary, and the spot on which such materials are ignited, a space at least ten meters in width which is clear of all vegetation capable of carrying fire from such spot to the forest.

5) Restrictions on the collection and stacking of inflammable forest produce of inflammable material outside the boundary of or in the forest. Any person collecting such inflammable material, that is to say, forest produce such as grass, dried leaves and pine needles, firewood, timber, bamboo and resin, on a land adjoining a forest, or a holder of a pass or permit issued by a Forest Officer, or a person exercising his privilege or right to collect such forest produce from a forest, shall stack it at, as the case may be, in an open space in the forest as the Divisional Forest Officer may, by general or special order, specify, and shall isolate such stacks in such manner that, if it catches fire, the fire shall not spread to the surrounding area to endanger the forests.

5) Precautions to be taken at camping places :- (1) No person shall camp in a forest, except in a camping place specially cleared and set apart and duly notified for the said purpose by the Divisional Forest Officers. (2) A person camping at such camping place may light fire for the purpose of cooking or for any other purpose in such a manner as not to endanger the forest or any building, shed and property at the camping place. (3) A person camping at the camping place shall, before vacating it, collect in the centre of the camping place all inflammable material, which is to be left behind, and shall carefully extinguish all fires at the site.

Sir,

The Working Plan for Hamirpur Forest Division for the period of 2016-17 to 2027-28 written by Shri Anil Joshi, IFS has been examined in accordance with the provisions of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 as amended till date, National Working Plan Code, guidelines issued by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, New Delhi from time to time, National Forest Policy 1988 and orders dated 12th December 1996 of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in PIL WP (C) 202 of 1995 read with WP (C) 171 of 1996.

After careful consideration, I am directed to convey the Central Government's approval to the Working Plan Hamirpur Forest Division for the period of 2016-17 to 2027-28 under Section: 2' of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to observance of the following conditions:

1. The approval shall be effective from the date of issuance of this communication till 31.03.2028.
2. Forest area should be surveyed and demarcated with boundary pillars in a time bound programme. The construction of RCC/PCC pillars of size 4' above ground should be inscribed with latitude and longitude taken with DGPS along with fore bearing and back bearing.
3. All the provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and various Rules & Guidelines issued under the Act shall be strictly enforced.
4. Yield obtained from dead, dry & salvaged timber will form part of prescribed yield and in case prescribed yield has been achieved from dead & dry volume, no further felling will be carried out. Yield from dead, dry & salvaged timber must not exceed the prescribed yield in the Working Plan.
5. All the fellings must commensurate with regeneration and no fellings would be permitted unless funds for regeneration are available. In this regard, orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India will be strictly complied with.
6. Intensive protection measures against fire, biotic interference and encroachment in forests shall be taken up.
7. All the prescriptions prescribed in the working plan regarding plantation, protection and development of the forest area will be strictly followed and any change in the prescriptions will be treated as deviation for which prior approval of competent authority will be obtained.
8. Sufficient budgetary allocations be ensured for timely implementation of various prescriptions regarding protection, regeneration and development of the forests.
9. Mid term review of the Working Plan will be taken up on expiry of 7th year of the plan period.
10. Separate account of development fellings in Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 cases and felling due to Working Plan prescriptions be maintained in the Control Form.

11. The felling of trees in areas having slope more than 30 degree and along the bank of river/streams shall not be undertaken.
12. The construction of new roads in forest area shall not be taken up for the purpose of extraction of timber etc.
13. Fire protection measures shall be taken up annually and adequate funds for this purpose shall be made available by State Government.
14. It may be ensured that no activity is permitted/taken up in forest area in violation of the provision of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
15. Working Plan is technically approved. However, felling in forests and other operations will be undertaken only as per orders issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court from time to time in W.P.No. 202/95 as well as in similar writ petitions as applicable.
16. In case the regeneration works in the areas worked in a year are not taken up in the subsequent year, then felling of trees in forest area shall not be undertaken unless facts are appraised to Central Government and concurrence is obtained for taking up felling operations as per the working plan prescriptions.
17. The detailed report indicating area harvested and the area regenerated in a year shall be sent to this office by 30th of April every year.
18. This approval does not *ipso-facto* imply approval of any proposed non-forestry activities requiring separate clearance under Forest (Conservation) Act. Such activities shall not be undertaken until separate forest clearance is obtained under the Act.
19. Over and above 1000 (one thousand) meters altitude, no felling of trees shall be taken up. The trees in these areas shall not be felled till the clearance is accorded by Hon'ble Supreme Court and/or by Central Government.
20. It may please be ensured that provisions of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and guidelines issued there under are strictly followed while implementing working plan prescriptions.
21. The Central Government reserves the right to review, modify or withdraw this approval, if any of the conditions of approval are not implemented or amendment to plan is necessitated.
22. Timely steps may please be initiated for revision of working plan to ensure that the revised working plan is place by the year 2028-29.

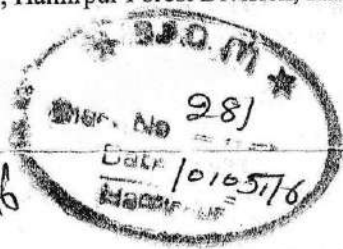

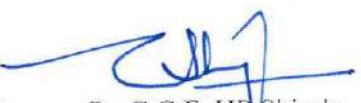
